



### **Greek School Curriculum:** Do you feel the class is at the appropriate level for your child?\*



## **Greek School Curriculum:** How would you rate the level of student learning of the Greek language?\*



# **In-School Learning:** Which of the following is the MOST important to you?\*





# **In-School Learning:** Which of the following is the LEAST important to you?\*




## **In-School Learning:** How would you rate the level of student learning of the Greek culture?\*

## In-School Learning: How would you rate the level of student learning of the Greek Orthodox faith?\*



### **In-School Learning:** Do you feel that your child is progressing at an appropriate pace?\*







### **At-Home Learning:** How often is Greek spoken at home?\*





## **At-Home Learning:** How many hours per week does your child spend on Greek School homework?\*





## **At-Home Learning:** How do you feel about the amount of weekly homework?\*





## **At-Home Learning:** How do you feel about the difficulty of the weekly homework?\*









**Teaching:** Do you feel that the school's teachers have the expertise to meet the needs of your child(ren)?\*





**Communications:** How would you rate the level of communications between the school and parents regarding upcoming school events - both educational and cultural?\*



### **Communications:** How would you rate the communication between you and your child's teacher?\*









#### **Logistics & Safety:** Do the current days and times of Greek school meet the needs of your schedule?\*



#### **Logistics & Safety** Do you feel classes start/end on time?\*





# **Logistics & Safety:** Are you satisfied with the cancellation procedures?\*



my child is not presently a student in Greek school.

when he did attend-he had no problems with reading and learning how to write but he did have a problem with the conversational part(almost all of the students came from homes where the language was spoken and they were fluent-he was not and it negatively impacted on his learning. He later took Spanish -not spoken in the home and became fluent-reading, writing and verbal- and is to this day even though it is NOT the language he uses daily)

I think the language should be taught using the methods which foreign languages are taught in private(or public schools). I believe that Greek culture should be taught as it is helpful when the students study cultures in their future learning experiences.
